

- Staying Home Leaving Violence
 SHLV supports female victim/survivors
 of domestic and family violence (DFV) by
 promoting housing stability and supporting
 women and their children to be safer.

Group work programs for women and children impacted by domestic and family violence (DFV). These trauma informed programs provide group sessions during school terms to validate experiences of DFV in a safe and supportive environment.

Engage2Change

Men's Behaviour Change Program (MBCP) holds men to account for their use of domestic violence and provides men the opportunity to take responsibility for their use of violence in a safe and inclusive group setting.

Kempsey Families also provides intensive case management for men seeking support in their journey to non-violence and provides assistance with housing, D&A, mental health, Family Law and court matters. Specialised support is also offered to women and children from current or past relationships.

OUR **PROGRAMS**



The Red Shed Playgroup

Offers a culturally appropriate, facilitated playgroup for parents/carers and children 0-5 years. Share a social, playful and craft focused environment.

Wednesdays 10.00am-12.00pm

Family/Parenting Case Worker

Support for parents and carers of children 0-12. Group work or one-on-one programs for parenting strategies include:

- Triple P
- Bringing Up Great Kids
- Circle of Security
- Specialist Family Case Worker

Support and case management for vulnerable young people 12-17 years, including their parents and families in the conversation. Referral to Tuning Into Teens group sessions available.

 Young Parents and Domestic Violence Specialist Case worker

Case management, one-on-one family work, partnerships in parenting - for young parents aged 14-25 & their children with a focus on domestic and family violence support and advocacy.
